## English Language Arts

- Identify numbers 0-5
- Count up to 5 objects in a line
- Identify basic colors
- Identify basic shapes (circle, square, triangle, rectangle)



## Science

- Recognize living vs. nonliving things
- Understand living things grow and need food
- Compare night sky and day sky
- Be familiar with the 4 seasons



## Physical Education

- Walk with a heel-toe gait
- Walk in a straight line

- Dress oneself
- Use the bathroom by oneself (potty trained)
- Share with others
- Respect feelings of others
- Respect others' belongings
- Understand rules and consequences
- Follow a direction
- Listen to others
- Use proper voice volume for inside vs. outside
- Hold and use writing utensils in a 3-finger grip

## Social Studies

- Identify important holidays
- Recognize some community helpers (police, firefighters, nurses)
- Recognize a map
- Understand some people are famous (including our leaders)

Visit the Arts Council's Arts Market (6/2, 7/7, or 8/4 from 8a.m – 12 p.m.)

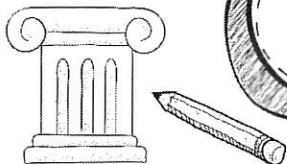
Find an inspirational quote. Write it and make the letters fancy. Decorate your quote with a few designs or pictures.
